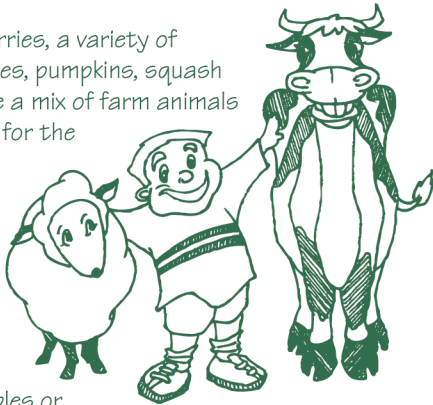


JOIN US IN GREENBANK

We grow strawberries, a variety of summer vegetables, pumpkins, squash and hay. We have a mix of farm animals humanely raised, for the children to visit.

To enhance your day at the farm we offer you the option of adding pick your own strawberries, seasonal vegetables or pumpkins for your group. (A small extra charge will apply)

SOIL HABITATS AND COMMUNITIES

Focusing on one topic gives students the opportunity to go beyond a basic understanding of these concepts and progress to analyzing the information and applying it to their daily lives, learning how their attitudes and actions can affect their world.

Learning and using appropriate vocabulary in their investigations, explorations and observations is emphasized in activities which are fun, informative, hands on and interactive.

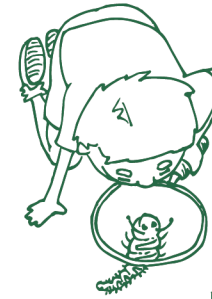
SOIL

Soil is alive and essential to our survival. What is it composed of? How is it made? What is needed for healthy plant growth? How do we protect it and keep it healthy? This is a fun, interactive

themed day where the children investigate soil and answer these questions with the goal of saving the alien planet TRID.

With this in mind the students will -

- Demonstrate an understanding of the similarities and differences between various soils (forest and field comparison) and the components that make up soil
- Recognize the dependence of humans and other living things on soil and how urban development and our behaviour is affecting our survival
- Recognize soil's importance as a source of materials for making useful objects
- Learn about composting and the regeneration of soil



HABITATS AND COMMUNITIES

Over the stream and into the woods to an animal's house we go! Discover some of nature's best homes on our house hunters' tour. You will explore different habitats - Field, Meadow, Forest and Wetlands.

Students will investigate:

- similarities and differences of these habitats
- identify the various factors involved in specific habitats and determine how organisms adapt to these environments and their survival tactics
- the food chain and web and the interrelationships of plants and animals
- build your own shelter

With urbanization close by there is ample opportunity to observe and discuss the effects humans have in altering the environment.
