Our mission is to nurture the farming connection, highlighting the significance farms play in the student's everyday lives.

Our outdoor activities are engaging, inquiry-driven, and hands-on to keep learning fun for all ages. They aim to spark children's wonder and curiosity about farming and the natural world. As students dig into the workings of our farm, they'll gain a deeper knowledge and understanding of where their food comes from, empowering them to make healthier food choices.

The “Nitty Gritty” of our Farm Tours



Activities in our [Farming Foundations](#) AND [Farm and Forest](#) tours incorporate science curriculum objectives customized to your student's grade, age and abilities.

Fall Tours September to November highlight pumpkins and the fall farm harvest. All our tours include a pie pumpkin as a take-home item that the children pick.

Two and three-hour tours are available. Our most popular tour length is 3 hours. This allows the students time to fully enjoy all our farm has to offer including time for lunch and play. It also works well with bus schedules.

Farming Foundations (all ages)

2-hour tour - \$13.00 each+ HST

3-hour tour-\$14.00 each+ HST

Farm and Forest (grades 1 plus)

3-hour tour - \$14.50 each + HST

For adequate supervision - we allow one adult free for every 5 students (this includes teachers and assistants). Adults accompanying children with special needs are free.

A deposit equal to the minimum charge of 20 students per group (a purchase order number if a TDSB school) is required **to confirm your booking date.**

They will accompany your group for your entire tour, working closely with you to ensure that our tour activities align with your classroom objectives.

Children and adults should dress for the weather conditions on the day of their tour. Our farm can be cooler, windier, and muddier than urban areas. Hats, mitts, coats, and boots may be needed.

We spend as much time outdoors in the fresh air as possible while keeping in mind the children's well-being and safety.

On unfavorable weather days – some indoor lunch and activity space is available.



Take home more than memories – Take home delicious!

Our on-farm market can be an integral part of your tour. It shows your students the variety of seasonal, Ontario-grown fruits and vegetables available and how their season can be extended. Conversations of what they see helps deepen their understanding of defining locally grown and the importance of farms and the rural community.

The seasons are evident in the produce available on our farm.

Our farm market is open for business during your visit.

Upon booking your tour you will receive links to our online educational videos [Lessons from the Farm](#), videos, 5 – 7 minutes long, which feature our farm sharing some of the key lessons we teach.



Children who view these lessons before their visit are more comfortable upon arrival and dig deeper into the farm experience.

Viewing them after the tour provides a valuable review of the day they have spent exploring our farm.
